WHW Year in Review

The mission of WHW is to provide comprehensive employment support services to empower disadvantaged men, women and teens to achieve economic self sufficiency through employment success. Since 1993, WHW has helped over 30,000 clients get and keep a job. Services provided include resume development and interviewing skills, educational workshops, computer classes, job placement services, interview appropriate professional apparel, image consulting and transportation services. All of these services are provided *at no cost or obligation* to clients or our nonprofit partners.

2011-2012 was an exceptional growth year for WHW. We earned the highest form of accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) after an extensive review process and served 35% more clients than the previous year. We also added critical transportation services and an Alumni Group for employed WHW clients that focuses on Professional Development.

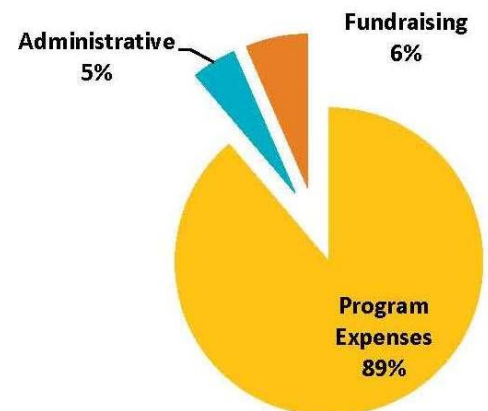
2011-2012 WHW Highlights
